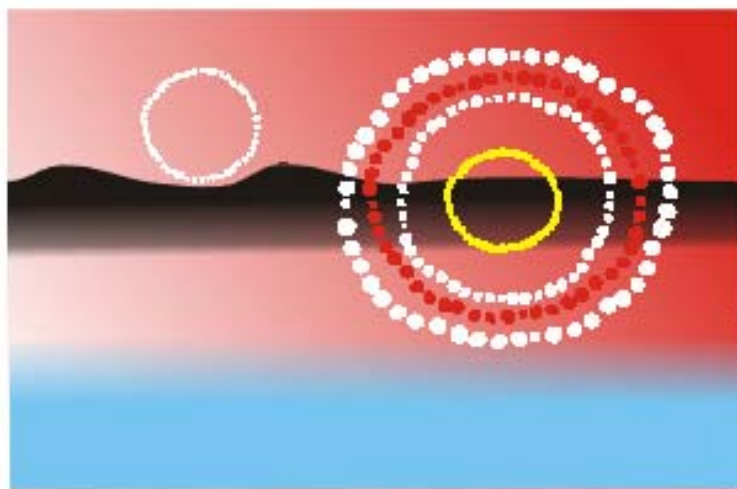

Foreword

Ruah Community Services is on an organisational journey to increase its responsiveness to the Aboriginal community. Ruah has developed a cross-organisational strategic framework spanning five years (2007-11) to guide this process. The framework is focused on ensuring a culturally competent workforce, providing Aboriginal people with access to culturally secure services and fostering an organisational culture that celebrates and promotes Aboriginal culture and its rightful place in Australian society.

Guided by this framework, Ruah seeks to include an Aboriginal perspective and to pay attention to Aboriginal people's needs as a matter of priority rather than as an afterthought. Thus when Ruah received Health Department of WA funding via the Mental Health Division for a resource unit focusing on children, families and mental health (now known as Perspectives) one of the initial resource projects was the compilation of a directory of existing resources relevant to Aboriginal people.

Ruah has also made a commitment to celebrating the anniversary of the Commonwealth Government's apology to the stolen generation that occurred on February 13, 2008. The occasion is used as an opportunity for Ruah to reflect on what it has done over the preceding 12 months to increase its responsiveness to Aboriginal people and identify the challenges that are still before it. At the 2009 anniversary, Ruah announced its intention to put this directory together. Twelve months later, at the 2010 gathering, this directory was launched. It is being made available to the wider community, in particular groups and agencies who provided information for its compilation. Ruah's hope is that its use will benefit the Aboriginal community by contributing to more effective service and community resource access for Aboriginal people.

Perspectives on children, families and mental health is a resource unit working to support the capacity of the health and human services sectors in Western Australia to work together to improve outcomes for children and families where a parent experiences a mental illness.

Perspectives arises from the work of the WA Children of Parent with Mental Illness (COPMI) Project. This work was initiated by the then Office of Mental Health in the commissioning of the Pathways to Resilience report (Office of Mental Health 2002) which describes the vulnerabilities of this group of children and their families and the systemic and clinical issues that impede service delivery and good outcomes.

The name **Perspectives** on children families and mental health is a very deliberate choice. It recognises that all services, sectors, professional and consumer and carer points of view are important if we are to further our understanding and ability to respond to children and families and the recovery journey.
